

In October 2018, the EU project "Cutting Crime Impact – Practice-based innovation in preventing, investigating and mitigating high-impact petty crime" was launched. The DPT is participating as a partner in this 36-month project.

**Background and Objectives:** Crime has a significant negative impact on European citizens' quality of life, community cohesion and the safety and security of the urban environment. The aim of the Cutting Crime Impact (CCI) project is to enable Law Enforcement Agencies (LEAs) and security policymakers to adopt a preventative, evidence-based and sustainable approach to tackling high-impact petty crime. Tailored to the needs of end-users, CCI will design, develop and demonstrate four Toolkits covering:

- 1. Predictive Policing
- 2. Community Policing
- 3. Crime Prevention through Urban Design and Planning
- 4. Measuring and Mitigating Citizens' Feelings of Insecurity

CCI aims to encourage wider EU adoption of effective approaches to safety and security, and will develop an extended European Security Model that includes high-impact petty crime and citizens' feelings of insecurity.

**Duration:** October 2018 – September 2021

Funding: The project is funded by the EU Horizon 2020 research and innovation programme.

**CCI Consortium:** The international consortium consists of twelve partners, including Law Enforcement Agencies from Germany, Spain, Estonia, Holland, Portugal and the United Kingdom. These are:

The consortium is led by the University of Salford (UK).

**Role of DPT:** DPT's primary role is to support the practical demonstration of toolkits, as well as the design and development of implementation support materials. In addition, DPT is supporting the dissemination, communication and exploitation of the project results. DPT will make use of its extensive networking experience to support the CCI project to maximise engagement with Law Enforcement Agencies, security policymakers and relevant civil society organisations.
