## AUTHORS' BIOGRAPHIES

**Frank Buchheit** studied Pedagogy, Criminology and Evaluation at the Universities of Tübingen and Saarbrücken. He is working for the State Office for Criminal Investigation Baden-Württemberg since 2002 (Crime Prevention, CVE, Evaluation). In addition he joined academic and evaluation initiatives in the CVE field and is working as a freelance Evaluator. He is Speakers of the Working-Group „Social Services“ at the German Evaluation Society (DeGEval – Gesellschaft für Evaluation e.V.).

**Paul Cobaugh**, Vice President of Narrative Strategies, prior to retirement from the US Army in 2015 spent the past decade supporting the US Special Operations Command focused on CT and CVE. He is co-author of; Narrative Warfare, a Primer and Study Guide, Soft Power on Hard Problems: Strategic Influence in Irregular Warfare and co-edited Information Warfare, the lost tradecraft by Dr. Howard Gambrell Clark.

**European Forum for Urban Security (Efus) – Farid Bounouar, Juan Cristellys, Elizabeth Johnston, Moritz Konradi, Götz Nordbruch, Emilie Petit**, the authors were part Efus' project team for the EU project „Local Institutions Against Violent Extremism – LIAISE“. The project, conducted in two phases from 2014 to 2017, supported local authorities across Europe at implementing pilot projects to prevent violent extremism at the local level. It produced two publications which gather the knowledge and practical advice to local practitioners: Preventing and Fighting Radicalisation at the Local Level (Efus 2016) and Prevention of Radicalisation Leading to Violent Extremism: Methodological Guide for the Development of a Local Strategy.

Founded in 1987 under the auspices of the Council of Europe, the European Forum for Urban Security (Efus) is the only European network of local and regional authorities dedicated to urban security. It includes nearly 250 local and regional authorities from 16 countries.

**Joel Day** (Ph.D., University of Denver, 2015) is Visiting Research Scholar at the Joan B. Kroc Institute of Peace and Justice, University of San Diego.

**Dr. Asiem El Difraoui** is a political scientist and author specialized on the Southern Mediterranean and the Arab world. His specialties include jihadism, Arab media and Arab-youth culture. He is the co-founder of the Candid Foundation in Berlin and Paris, a think- and do- tank that actively promotes Euro-Mediterranean relations.

**Patrick Frankenberger** studied political science, cultural anthropology, medieval and modern history at the Johannes Gutenberg University in Mainz, Germany. He then began work for the project “Islamism on the Internet” at jugendschutz.net, and became head of the project in 2016. Since 2017 he has been the director of the department “Political Extremism” at jugendschutz.net, which undertakes research on Islamic and right-wing-extremist internet content and analyzes it in regard to legal statutes protecting minors.

**Scott Kleinmann** (Ph.D., King’s College London, 2018) is a Principal National Security Consultant at Jane’s.

**Daniel Koehler** studied comparative religion, political science and economics at Princeton University and Free University Berlin. After completing his Magister Artium degree he finished a post-graduate Master of Peace and Security Studies (M.P.S.) at the University of Hamburg. He specialized on topics such as terrorism, radicalization, and deradicalization. He worked as a deradicalization and family counselor in multiple programs and developed several methodological approaches to deradicalization, especially family counselling programs around the world. Daniel Koehler is also the co-founder of the first peer reviewed open access journal on deradicalization ([www.journal-derad.com](http://www.journal-derad.com)). In June 2015 Daniel Koehler was named a Fellow of George Washington University’s Program on Extremism at the Center for Cyber and Homeland Security. In 2016 he was appointed to be the first court expert on deradicalization in the United States of America at the District Court in Minneapolis. He has since then conducted risk assessment and deradicalization evaluations of terrorist offenders in prison and trained expert personnel from various US Government agencies.

Since 2016 he also works with the Ministry of the Interior in Baden-Württemberg/Stuttgart as a researcher to help coordinate the state wide prevention network against violent extremism and radicalization. In July 2017 Daniel became a member of the Editorial Board of the International Centre for Counter-Terrorism (ICCT) in The Hague. Daniel recently published two major monographies with Routledge, one on right-wing terrorism in Germany and another one on methods and tools within deradicalization and countering violent extremism.

**Dr. Susan Szmania** is a research analyst in the Office of Terrorism Prevention Partnerships at the U.S. Department of Homeland Security in Washington, D.C., U.S.A. From 2016-2017, she also served as a member of the federal government's interagency Countering Violent Extremism (CVE) Task Force to synchronize and prioritize CVE efforts in America. Previously, she held government and academic positions addressing terrorism prevention and CVE programs, including at the U.S. Department of State and the University of Maryland's National Consortium for the Study of Terrorism and Responses to Terrorism (START). Dr. Szmania holds a Ph.D. in Communication Studies from the University of Texas at Austin. **Asiye Sari-Turan**, studied natural sciences at the University of Hohenheim and worked after her graduation as a researcher at the Chemisches und Veterinäruntersuchungsamt Stuttgart (CVUA-S – official food control and animal health laboratory in Baden-Württemberg).

This was followed by several years of professional activities in the educational field. She gained experience in the field of school organization with a focus on the coordination of the subject group 'Naturwissenschaft und Technik' (NwT – science and technology) and also worked as a freelance speaker at various schools and educational institutions. Thereafter, she worked as a media education consultant for the Landesmedienzentrum Baden-Württemberg (Media Center of the state Baden-Württemberg) and was participated in the developing of media education modules for migrants in their native language (Turkish). Furthermore she developed modules, training concepts and teaching materials for different target groups. Parallel to these areas of work, she was involved in intercultural and interreligious dialogue, as well as in the field of sustainable development cooperation with a project visit to Azerbaijan.

She began her work on extremism and prevention in projects for the prevention of religious extremism. There she developed concepts for seminars and workshops for young people and multipliers from various educational fields. She participated in case discussion groups and worked as a freelance speaker for the Demokratiezentrum Baden-Württemberg (Democracy Center of Baden-Württemberg) on topics such as ‘Online Hate Speech’ and ‘anti-Muslim racism’ and participated in the development of pedagogical concepts in the field of primary prevention.

She currently works at the Ministry of Interior, Digitisation and Migration in Baden-Württemberg as a scientific consultant in the field of P/CVE and the formulation of training courses for professional staff at the ‘Landesbildungszentrum Deradikalisierung’ (LBZ Derad – State Training Center for Deradicalization).

**Clive Walker** is Professor Emeritus of Criminal Justice Studies at the School of Law, University of Leeds, where he has served as the Director of the Centre for Criminal Justice Studies (1987-2000) and as Head of School (2000-2005, 2010). He has written extensively on terrorism issues, with many published papers and books not only in the UK but also in several other jurisdictions, especially the USA. In 2003, he was a special adviser to the UK Parliamentary select committee which scrutinised what became the Civil Contingencies Act 2004, from which experience he published *The Civil Contingencies Act 2004: Risk, Resilience and the Law in the United Kingdom* (Oxford University Press, 2006). His books on terrorism are recognised and cited widely and include *Terrorism and the Law* (Oxford University Press, 2011), *The Anti-Terrorism Legislation*, (3rd ed., Oxford University Press, 2014), and the *Routledge Handbook of Law and Terrorism* (Routledge, 2015). More recent works have concentrated on the financing of terrorism, including, King, C., and Walker, C. (eds), *Dirty Assets: Emerging Issues in the Regulation of Criminal and Terrorist Assets* (Ashgate, Farnham, 2014) and King, C., Walker, C. and Gurule, J. (eds), *Handbook of Criminal and Terrorism Financing Law* (Palgrave Macmillan, London, 2018). He was appointed in 2010 by the Home Office as Senior Adviser to the Independent Reviewer of Terrorism Legislation. He became a Queen’s Counsel (Honorary) in 2016.
