The work of the Crime Victim Assistance Offices of the Ministry of Justice will be presented, alongside a panorama on how the Ministry of Justice is going to address the need to adapt the existing tools for collecting and analysing statistical data on these Offices so that they are useful for the staff of these services, allowing, in turn, to offer true, quality statistical information that can be exploited and disseminated. A presentation on the SAV (Victim Attention Service) of País Vasco will show how the services for crime victims, not depending of the Ministry of Justice, provide crime victims with help and support.

- How the possible lack of coordination between different Crime Victim Support Services may affect the referral of crime victims to the adequate service? Current situation in other EU Member States.
- What added value can statistical information collection systems provide to the work of assistance to crime victims carried out by support services? Current situation in other EU Member States.
