
# 1. The context (1/2)

- no reliable statistics on true extent of cyber



- c.f.Chapter III Budapest Convention but Convention's mutual assistance provision are diluted – safe havens exist

- 2005/222/JHA, but takes into account recent developments, especially the criminal use of botnets for large-scale attacks.


feasibility study

  - precise nature of tasks




